CITIZENS' COMMENTS


- Jarret L., resident of Glasgow Village, would like to offer his services to the City of Riverview, with tree removal, landscaping, and community service, has seen lots of work that can be done and would like to help.
- Glen C., a property owner in the City of Riverview, states that he is unable to access his property due to Stimson Dr. being blocked off, Mayor Mike Cornell, ensures that there will be no abatements or fines for this property until massive clean up is completed and he is able to access the property to maintain the yard and house.
- Scott A., resident residing on Rivermont, expressing that he has received an abatement letter in September 2024, but the problem property is the neighbor next door. Mayor Cornell asked why it took so long to come to the board meeting and present his issue the Mayor and Board of Aldermen, so that the issue could be rectified in a timely manner.
- Gagandup G., who is seeking to be the new owner of Raqqa Mart, located at 352 Chamber Rd., would like to know what the expectations are of the store owner. Mayor Cornell explains that there should be no loitering in front of the property, there should be working cameras on site. Gagandup agrees with the conditions and wants to comply with all City of Riverview ordinances and laws.
- Ryan L., with Kelly R., representatives of Globe Life insurance company, wants to present new benefits at no cost to the City of Riverview.
- Katrina F., informs that she assisted with the storm in the City of St Louis, where lots of people were displaced due to the tornado, would like to know if the City of Riverview would like to partner with her with a Go-Fund Me account. Mayor Cornell explains that as a governing body the city can not participate in a Go-Fund Me.
- James R., acknowledged the presence of Sergeant Sutton at the intersection of Chambers Rd. and Lilac Dr., because no one adheres to the stop sign and it is extremely dangerous. Also has questions about the large semi-trucks that come through the same intersection, where there is a sign posted stating "No Trucks Through", Mayor Cornell explained that this is a St Louis County road, but if there are trucks coming through the intersection the drivers will be fined if overweight.

Adjournment: With no further business to discuss, Mayor Cornell adjourned the meeting at 7:27pm


