**CITIZENS' COMMENTS**


- Merlene D., resident, wants to thank the Mayor for addressing the issue of overgrowth in the common area in Denese Hills, neighbors don't want to help maintain it.

**Adjournment:** With no further business to discuss, Mayor Cornell adjourned the meeting at 7:25pm


